## Playing by the Rules

Here we are again, another New Year! As promised in last month's article for all of you

Match Players some Two Stroke Penalties which are Loss of Hole in match play.

### 4-4 Carrying excess clubs (Max. 14).....2 Hole Maximum Adjustment

8-1 Asking for or giving advice to anyone in the competition playing on the course other than your partner.

8-2a Placing an object to indicate the line of play and leaving it there when striking the ball.

13-2 Improving lie of ball, the area of intended swing or line of play or removing a boundary stake.

13-3 Building a stance.

13-4 Touching a loose impediment in a hazard when ball is in the hazard.

14-2b Allowing your partner or caddy to position themselves on or close to an extension of the line of play or line of putt behind the ball when striking the ball. (Penalty applies to your partner as well if it assists them.)

14-5 Playing a moving ball – except in water 14-6.

15-3 Playing a wrong ball.

16-1 Touching the line of putt (you or your partner).

17-3 Ball striking Flagstick or Attendant unless removed or held up without players authority.

20-7 Playing a ball dropped or placed in wrong place.

### 2-5 Making a Claim:

1. Notify opponent you are making a claim.
2. Give opponents the facts of the situation.
3. State you wish a ruling from the Committee..

### CONTINUE WITH THE MATCH

4. Make your claim BEFORE anyone plays from the next tee, or if on the last hole BEFORE the last player leaves the green.
