FROM THE BOARD

I wanted to update the membership regarding the unpleasant odor in the Pro Shop, adjacent to the main stairwell and outside the Bob Cope Room. We hired a contractor to complete a comprehensive analysis of the plumbing/waste system from the inside out with the use of cameras to capture internal pictures of the pipes to figure out exactly what we are dealing with. Initial results show that the waste system is structurally sound and the issue lies with the deterioration of the venting system within this area. We have changed out many vent pipes above the Golf Shop, under the Main Bar and in the walls next to the Cope Room. There are other areas that we cannot access unless we tear the Club down to the studs, which is the last thing we want to do. Bottom line, the Board of Directors is committed to fix the problem once and for all no matter what the cost! We are hopeful to put another challenge behind us! Updates to the membership will be sent as additional information is available.

On another note, I cannot express how critically important it is to take care of our fine golf course in the rainy conditions. Staying completely on the cart paths when we are restricted to "cart path only" conditions eliminates the need for rut repair and restoration of damaged turf. Also, when the turf is soft and wet, divots are very easily repaired by replacing the divot and/or kicking in and leveling the damaged grass. A good philosophy to live by is to repair the condition in a way that the result is what YOU would be pleased to play out of or through whether it be in the fairway, rough, sand bunker, or on the green.

Lastly, I hope to see all of you at the Presidents dinner on Friday, March 29th! I am planning a casual evening with a crooner to kick off the evening and some golden oldies after dinner.

TEAM PLAY TIPS

Team play is a partnership event – two partners-one ship!!

- a. Forget your score, play to win with strategy and by helping one another.
- b. Play or putt out of turn if it helps your partner.
- c. Ask or give advice to your partner if needed.
- d. Do not stand directly behind your partner when he or she is preparing to make a stroke. Watch the putt break or the speed from the other side of the hole.

2. Before starting play:

- a. Ask your opponent if their handicap on their card is correct.
 If you don't and later you discovered they played to a higher handicap it is too late to file a claim.
- b. Count your clubs! Make sure you only have fourteen (14).

3. Remember:

- a. You may always immediately recall an opponents shot played out of turn or from a wrong teeing area.
- b. There is <u>no penalty</u> if you or your opponent moves their ball <u>during search</u> but it <u>must be replaced</u>, not dropped at a spot estimated if not known. **One stroke penalty if dropped**.
- c. Always lift your ball if you think it will assist your opponent or have any other ball lifted that might interfere with you or your partner. If you are on the green in a position to help your partner's next shot, <u>DON'T RUN UP & MARK IT!!</u> Wait to see if your opponent asks.

Don't Forget:

- You may <u>always</u> play a ball from where you last played from -<u>Penalty One Stoke</u>.
- b. If you have a claim, you <u>must make it before anyone plays from the</u> <u>next tee</u> it's <u>too late unless</u> you were not aware of a previous breach.

Playing By The Rules

<u>Dropping the Ball</u>: The ball <u>must</u> stay within the <u>specific drop area</u>. If ball rolls out, a <u>redrop is</u> <u>required</u>. Drop <u>twice then place it</u>. If taking an <u>unplayable ball</u> and the ball rolls back into the same area you <u>must redrop</u> under the <u>penalty of one stroke each time you drop!</u> You might want to go back & play from where you <u>made your last stroke</u> before dropping. Consider playing from where you last played your ball from.
