



* * *Playing by the Rules* * * By Carol Stewart, USGA, PGA, SCGA Rules Official

During the year we have covered all the one stroke penalties & **two stroke** (now referred to as the <u>("general penalty") penalties</u> so I thought it might be a good time to go over the worst penalty of all "<u>Disqualification</u>."

- 1. <u>ADVICE</u>: Defined as any counsel or suggestion which could influence a player in deciding his play, choice of club or method of making a stroke and a player can ask or give it <u>only to his partner</u>.
- 2. <u>Practice</u>: (Before or between rounds in <u>Stroke Play</u>. Check with Committee if allowed.
- 3. Four Ball Stroke Play: (Gross score to count not individually identifiable.) Circle Score!!
- 4. **Doubt as to Procedure:** Failure to report facts to Committee **before returning score card.**
- 5. *Handicap*: Recording a higher handicap <u>or</u> in *playing off a higher handicap in Match Play*.
- 6. Excess Club: Declared Out of Play then used.
- 7. Undue Delay Repeated Offense or Discontinuance of Play.
- 8. Agreeing to Waive Rules.

The Following Rules (MUST BE RECTIFIED:)

- 1. Failure to Hole Out.
- 2. Playing a Wrong Ball (Stroke Play).
- 3. Playing from a **Wrong Place**. (Stroke Play)
- 4. Playing from **Outside the Teeing Area** or **Wrong Teeing Area**

<u>Player or Players are Disqualified if they fail to rectify the penalties</u> in bold print <u>before</u> <u>playing from the next teeing area</u>, or <u>in the case of the last hole, before leaving the putting green</u>.







